Alternatives to Jail

Alternatives to Jail Funding

Directed at programs, projects and/or activities that address or create Alternatives to Jail. Call for Proposal informed by community and guidance rom a 26-member advisory committee.

Vision

- Move away from a criminal justice system response to one of trauma, mental health and substance misuse crisis response, with care and services provided first, and jail as a last resort
- Increase diversion opportunities
- Integrate supports that follow someone across services, programs, and institutions while in and after they leave – the justice system
- Provide culturally relevant and trauma-informed services and whole-person approach
- Support care coordination, information sharing and release planning



Applying for Funding

- Check eligibility at caring4denver.org/grants
- Register for an account by 7PM MDT 5 days before submission deadline
 - Registrations due April 28th 7PM MDT for Alternatives to Jail
 - Proposal submissions due May 4th 7PM MDT

FAQs

Serving City and County of Denver definition

- An individual physically residing in the City
- An individual experiencing homelessness presenting in the City and intending to stay in the City
- An individual, under 21 years of age and in the custody of Denver Human Services (DHS)
- An individual, under 18 years of age and in primary legal and residency custody of a City resident
- A non-City resident who is placed in a mental health or substance misuse program while in a City Jail

Is there a minimum or maximum to request?

• Requests should be reasonable to meet the goals of the program being proposed
